ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY.**

BACKGROUND

According to Cambridge Advanced Learner's Dictionary 3rd Edition defined policy as a set of ideas or a plan of what to do in particular situations that has been agreed officially by a group of people, a business organization, a government or a political party. Also, Merriam Webster defines policy as carefulness or wisdom in the management of affairs; management or procedure based primarily on material interest.

Policies are typically promulgated through official written documents. Policy documents often come with the endorsement or signature of the executive powers within an organization to legitimize the policy and demonstrate that it is considered in force. Such documents often have standard formats that are particular to the organization issuing the policy. The followings are the content of policy such as a purpose statement, an applicability and scope statement, an effective date, a responsibilities section and Policy statements. Finally some policy contains additional sections like background and definition etc.

The Board of Directors of THREELIONS SAKAJOE INTERNATIONAL SECURITY LIMITED. (the "Company") is vested with responsibility for formulating the strategy and approving the Corporate Policies of the Company and for organising the internal control systems. Pursuant to the Mission, Vision, and Values of the 3Lions group, the Company's leadership in the development of clean energy and respect for the environment are the pillars of its energy production model and the factor that distinguishes it in its industry as one of the leading companies worldwide. In the exercise of these responsibilities and in order to further develop the Company's corporate philosophy, the Board of Directors approves this Environmental Policy.

1. Purpose Statement

The Environmental Policy is intended to extend to all stakeholders related to the Company and to the companies belonging to the group of which the Company is the controlling entity, within the meaning established by law (the "Group"), its devotion to leadership in the development of clean energy and respect for the environment. In this regard, the Company's Board of Directors believes the environment to be a central element of the concept of sustainability, and particularly one of the three pillars for reaching a sustainable energy model, together with competitiveness and the safety of supply. The Company, aware of its potential to contribute to the preservation and protection of the environment, has voluntarily assumed the responsibility to lead the fight against climate change and to preserve biodiversity, in accordance with the provisions of the Policy against Climate Change and the Biodiversity Policy, respectively.

The Company also conceives of respect for the environment as one of the corporate values that determines its entire business strategy, as it is key to the configuration of a sustainable energy model, which in the environmental dimension translates into lower emissions and greater efficiency and the production and use of energy, as well as in complying with environmental laws and regulations and the best international practices in this area.

Given all of the above, through a policy of transparent information and a strategy of constant dialogue, the Company responds to the expectations of its stakeholders with respect to the preservation of the environment, ever more stringent regulatory requirements, and constant scrutiny of management by analysts, assessors, and various agents of civil society, in line with the Sustainable Development Goals (2015-2030) recently approved by the United Nations.

2. Scope of Application

This Environmental Policy applies to all companies of the Group, as well as to all investees not belonging to the Group over which the Company has effective control, within the lawfully established limits. At those companies in which the Company has an interest and to which this policy does not apply, the Company will promote, through its representatives on the boards of directors of such companies, the alignment of their own policies with those of the Company.

3. An effective date

This Environmental Policy was initially approved by the Board of Directors on 13th January, 2018.

4. A responsibilities section

The management bodies of the various companies making up the Group are responsible for the determination and implementation of the Environmental Policy within the 3Lions group, in accordance with the corporate and governance structures and the business model of the Group defined in the Policy for the Definition and Coordination of the 3Lions Group and Foundations of Corporate Organisation.

The Company has for such purposes created an organisation that manages the environment in a decentralised manner. The Board of Directors and the management team of the Company are thus responsible for establishing and supervising the application, respectively, of environmental strategy and organisation at the Group level. For its part, the Company's Innovation, Sustainability, and Quality Division, which reports to the Area of the Office of the Chairman, proposes the management models and systems, specifies the environmental guidelines and the goals associated therewith, coordinating all environmental action of the Group. Without bias to the foregoing, the Energy Policies and Climate Change Division, which also reports to the Area of the Office of the Chairman, proposes the guidelines relating to the Company's Policy against Climate Change.

Finally, applying the principle of subsidiarity, specific matters affecting the business that are related to the environment are handled and resolved in each case by the environmental divisions of each business.

5. Policy statements

To achieve the implementation of these environmental policy. We will create a "Environmental Committee", which will definitely bring solutions to their market, thus harmonizing the conduct of their activities with the legitimate right of current and future generations to enjoy an adequate environment. Then the committee shall be guided by the following main principles of conduct:

- a) Respect applicable environmental laws and regulations in the countries in which it operates and, to the extent possible, anticipate the application of new legal provisions when more stringent, and comply with voluntarily assumed commitments and with international rules of environmental conduct, particularly when they are more ambitious.
- b) Establish indicators and reporting systems that allow for knowing and objectively comparing the environmental impact of the various activities of the Group, classifying them and allowing for the traceability thereof, in order to be able to use such information efficiently in the decision-making process of the businesses of the Group.
- c) Integrate fully the environmental dimension and respect for the natural environment into the strategy of the Group.
- d) Ensure at all times the compatibility of environmental protection, the meeting of social needs in the energy arena, and the sustainable creation of value through innovation and eco-efficiency, contributing to a sustainable and responsible energy model.
- e) Consume responsibly, making sustainable use of resources and increasing consumption of renewable resources to the extent possible.

- f) Share acquired knowledge with their customers in order to improve their environmental behaviour in connection with energy.
- g) Establish appropriate management systems, based on a philosophy of ongoing improvement, that help to reduce environmental risk.
- h) Identify and incorporate available technical improvements for the production and distribution of electric power from a technical financial, environmental, and social standpoint.
- i) Performance of internal and external audits.
- j) Promote behaviour of the Group that is in line with the principles of this Environmental Policy, assigning positive value to alignment therewith, particularly in the selection of contractors and suppliers.
- k) Establish a constructive dialogue with Government Agencies, regulatory authorities, non-governmental organisations, multilateral agencies, shareholders, customers, local communities, and other stakeholders in order to:
 - i. Mutually understand the interests and objectives of each of the parties.
 - ii. Work jointly in the search for solutions to environmental problems and dilemmas.
 - iii. Contribute to the development of a useful public policy from the environmental standpoint that is efficient in economic terms.
 - iv. Raise awareness of the importance of taking measures to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.
- n) Report transparently on environmental results and actions, establishing the appropriate channels to favour communication with the stakeholders and recognizing both achievements and aspects that need to be improved.

CONCLUSION

In every policy in the world, it is the committee that will be created for the purpose of the policy that will carry out the majority of that particular policy because there are instruments for the adoption and promotion of that committee apart from the policy statement that make available the main guiding principles of the committee.

Furthermore, various levels of the organisation will be aware of the importance of respect for the policy in the planning and subsequent implementation of all the actions of the organization, and that all employees contribute with their daily work to the achievement of the goals set in the policy.

The basis of environmental policy in Nigeria is contained in the 1999 Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria. Pursuant to section 20 of the Constitution, the State is empowered to protect and improve the environment and safeguard the water, air and land, forest and wildlife of Nigeria. In addition to this, section 2 of the Environmental Impact Assessment Act of 1992 (EIA Act) provides that the public or private sector of the economy shall not undertake or embark on or authorise projects or activities without prior consideration of the effect on the environment.

In this regard, the Federal Government of Nigeria has promulgated various laws and Regulations to safeguard the Nigerian environment. These include: Federal Environmental Protection Agency Act of 1988 (FEPA Act) repealed by the National Environmental Standards Regulation Agency (NESREA) Act 2007.
