Health experts have raised alarms over the impact of a major outbreak, warning the country's unprepared and underfunded healthcare system could be quickly become overwhelmed. The extension of the lockdown is expected to add to the late hard ship of millions of Nigerians living hand-to-mouth on less than one dollar a day. The lockdown is one difficult rule for Nigerians who get their daily bread from their day to day work. The government has pledged a series of support measures to ease the financial pain for the most vulnerable, but there have been widespread complaints that not enough is being done for those facing hunger. Vast majority of Nigerians depend on daily wages. Fear of hunger, not the virus.

The lockdown has been increased for another 14 days by the president of Nigeria and still the pandemic continues to increase. People are still complaining about hunger while some complaints about the issues of thieves coming to rob their homes. Police said on Monday that they were bolstering forces in Lagos and Ogun states after 200 suspects were arrested amid fears of a spike in crime during the lockdown. Citizens are no longer afraid of the lockdown but hunger and the increase in crime rate. We keep praying.
