People may also become infected by touching a contaminated surface and then touching their eyes, nose or mouth. The virus can survive up to surface for up to 72 hours. Common symptoms include fever, cough and shortness of breath. Complications may include pneumonia and acute respiratory distress syndrome. There is no known vaccine or specific antiviral treatment. Primary treatment is symptomatic and supportive therapy.

Recommended preventive measures include handwashing, covering one's mouth when coughing, maintaining distance from other people and monitoring and self-isolation for people who suspect they are infected. Authorities worldwide has responded by implementing travel restrictions, quarantines, curfews and stay-at-home orders, workplace safety controls, and facility closures.

The pandemic has led to severe global socioeconomic disruption, the postponement or cancellation of sporting, religious and political cultural events and widespread shortages of supplies exacerbated by panic buying. CORONA VIRUS PANDEMIC AND THE EFFECTS OF THE LOCKDOWN AND RESTRICTION OF MOVEMENT ON NIGERIANS.

The 2019-20 Coronavirus pandemic is an ongoing pandemic of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) caused by Severe acute respiratory Syndrome Coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2). The outbreak was identified in Wuhan, China, in December 2019. The World Health Organization declared the outbreak to be a public health emergency of international concern on 30 January 2020, and recognised it as a pandemic on 11 March 2020.

As of 28 April 2020, more than 2.47 million cases of COVID-19 has been reported in 185 countries and territories, resulting in more than 169,000 deaths. More than 645,000 people have recovered although there may be a possibility of relapse or reinfection.

The Virus is primarily spread between people during close contact, often via small droplets produced by coughing, sneezing.
