

An insurgency can be fought via counter-insurgency warfare, and may also be opposed by measures to protect the population and by political and economic actions of various kinds, as well as propaganda aimed at undermining the insurgents' claims against the incumbent regime. As a concept, insurgency's nature is ambiguous. The stages of insurgency include; Organization, consolidation and preservation of base areas Guerrilla warfare Decision 1. Organization, Consolidation and Preservation of Base Areas: This essentially means establishing a core cadre as part of the movement. Insurgents generally arrive in remotely located areas, and live with the locals. These are places towards which government has little or no attention. They propagate their ideas and recruit followers. This is the conceptual stage for the rebels, since the numbers in these areas are small, it is easy for the insurgents keeping tabs on the population. 2. Guerrilla Warfare: The next phase involves the use of military means to heightened political effect, isolated attacks are planned- which are meant to serve a political purpose and to forward their propaganda. The aim is to put a fear of safety in the otherwise comfortable officials as well as gather attention. 3. Decision: This involves an all out war against the government, it may begin with the militia taking up arms against a small government structure to gather resources, killing informants, looting weapons cache etc. This would result in the emergence of military objectives as well as encourage more people to take up arms.
