According to a study on the reactions after rape by the American journal of orthopsychiatry, 96% percent of women said they were scared, shaking, or trembling a few hours after their attack. After even more passed, no previous symbols decreased while the levels of depression exhaustion and restlessness increases. Most survivors of rape have post-traumatic stress disorder. Some of the gynecological effect of rape includes vicinal or and bleeding or infection, hypoactive sexual desire disorder, vanishes or vicinal inflammation, dyspareunia (painful sexual intercourse), chronic pelvis pain etc.

In Nigeria today, rape in the eye of the society has always seem to be the victims fault, this is also one of the reason why rape in Nigeria today is what it is. The blame and questions always go to the victim. What was she wearing? Where was she? Why was she alone? What was she doing? Etc. as we can see the questions always end up going to the victim and at the end the rapist gets away with it.
