Later, David Adams, A professor of psychology at the Wesleyan university, Connecticut, who joined UNESCO in 1992 as an expert on brain mechanism of Aggressive behaviorior, the evolution of war, And the psychology of peace Activists, developed the essential ideas of a culture of peace. Adams then presented his memo to Federico mayor, UNESCO's director-general these two individuals worked meticulously until UNESCO drafted a culture of peace.

UNESCO conceived of a culture of peace as a set of ethical And Aesthetic values , habits and customs, Attitudes towards others, forms of behavior, and ways of life that draw on and express;

should not confuse Attitudes with the modes of behavior.

Behavior are the real actions we undertake. Our behavior should ordinarily be informed by our Attitudes, however this is not always so.
