The term citizen is a type of relationship that exist between the people and government.

Citizens have a set of rights and responsibilities including the right to participate in decisions that affect public welfare. In addition to the intrinsic democratic value, participation is an instrumental driver of democratic and socio-economic change, and a fundamental way to empower citizens.

Citizenship of a state may be acquired either by birth or by naturalisation. Citizenship can be perceived to be made up of civil citizenship, political citizenship and social citizenship. Civil citizenship: this refers to the rights necessary to protect individual liberty. For example; freedom of speech, justice e.t.c.

<u>Political citizenship:</u> this is associated with participation in the democratic exercise of political power, either as a member of a political community. For example; voting.

<u>Social citizenship:</u> this embodies the claim that citizens ought to have access to those resources that allow them to live a civilized existence in accordance with the standards prevailing in society.

Individual's rights and liberties are the groundwork of the state since it exist to enable men to live and develop fully. In order to let the citizen have a share in the running of his or her government, a group of rights are very essential. Rights emails the duties and responsibilities of a citizen in the state. Right is a privilege or pejorative conferred by law by another person or a group, when a privilege is expressed around the framework of the constitution then its a civil right.
