Citizen/ citizenship

The terms citizen has an inherently political meaning that implies a certain type of relationship between the people and the government. Citizen as a set of rights and responsibilities, including the right to participate in decisions that affect public welfare.

Citizenship of a state may be acquired either by birth or by naturalization . A man becomes a citizen of a particular state if his parents are citizens of that state of if he is born within the territory of that state. On the other hand, the process by which an individual person may voluntarily change his citizenship of a state to another state is known as naturalization. The condition of which naturalization are conferred vary from country to country.

Citizens' Rights
