The characters reveal how each mistake one person makes has an impact on the person himself and on it's surrounding.

2.) Character Analysis

Keizah: This is the main character of the story. She is fair skinned, medium in height and a little rotund. Keizah is a straight-laced and strong willed girl who cares about nothing else but facing her studies and making her parents proud. She was constantly being disturbed by a boy named Ademola who was infatuated with her. She was later convinced by her course mates to be nice to Ademola and accept him as a friend which later turned out to be a terrible mistake as she is eventually raped by Ademola. She was there on a academic visit seeking his help with her English assignment, he drugged and charmed her so she would be in a vulnerable state. She fled from she then meets Stella who helps her in her time of grief after the incident with Ademola, telling her that hope is not lost as she shares the testimony of what had happened to her earlier on in life. A few days later she discovers that Ademola is dead leaving her unconscious on the cold sick bed of the university health Centre. Due to her being in the health centre, her father makes enquiries of her health status only to discover that his daughter randomly child is pregnant at a young age. He had numerous dark spots in his life as a result of parental gap. This resulted to Nkanga Nwoko (K.K) a 400lvl English student stepping up and guiding him down a destructive part. His genuine love for Keziah is corrupted as K.K advices him to use the opportunity of her visit to his room to get what he has been longing for through a devious method. He heeds this advice and results to raping Keziah. He is down cast by the outcome of events as Keziah sees him as a monster. He is introduced to cultism and use of hard drugs by this so-called friend. He officially becomes a member of the sacred Red sparrows' confraternity but his membership is short-lived along with his life as he is killed accidentally by K.K in a cult clash. K.K is then sentenced to life imprisonment on account of various charges.
