QUESTION:

1) Attempt an incisive interrogation of Solomon A. Edebor's Good Morning Sodom, underscoring at least five underlying thematic thrusts the drama engages.

Answer:

A, Theme of love: in this play, love existed between the Richard's. - 3) What are the points of divergence between the published book and the film version of GOOD MORNING, SODOM?
