THEME OF GOOD MORNING, SODOM

1. THEME OF NEGATIVE PEER INFLUENCE:

Peer Influence is when you choose to do something you wouldn't otherwise do, because you want to feel accepted and valued by people. It was seen that Keizah's Course mates, Ovie and Bunmi convinced her to let loose and give Demola a chance. Demola was a victim of peer pressure. K.K succeeded in influencing him negatively he made Demola do so many terrible things, he made him leave hostel for town, join cult, take drugs and other atrocities that he committed.

2. THEME OF REGRET:

Regret is a feeling of sadness, repentance or disappointment over an occurrence or something one has done or failed to do. Regret is a theme that was somewhat dominant in the play "GOOD MORNING, SODOM". After raping Keizah Demola felt remorse for what he did for to her, Engineer Diran and Mrs Diran were contrite after they realized that they neglected their child, finally K.K felt sour after killing Demola.

3. THEME OF HATE:

After being raped by Demola, Keizah exhibited a strong sense of anger and intense dislike towards him, she was pushed to the point that she started cursing.

4. THEME OF DRUG ABUSE:

Drug abuse is the illegal use of drugs or the use of prescription or over the counter drugs for purposes other than those for which are meant to be used or in excessive amount. K.K, Demola, and Bentol were victims of drug abuse. Demola raped keizah under the influence of drugs.

5. THEME OF PARENTAL NEGLECT:

Neglect is the ongoing failure to meet a child's basic needs such as not giving attention to a child. In this context Keziah and Demola were victims of parental neglect. CHARACTER ANALYSIS

1. Keziah Richards:

Keizah Richards is one of the primary characters of the play "Good Morning Sodom" she is the mother of Mouritha and daughter of Dr Aworawo Richards and Mrs Joke Richards. She was a 200level student of Mayflower University. She is a well behaved and focused student, but later became a sufferer of Negative peer Influence, which led to her being raped and eventually became pregnant. She was neglected by her dad who later came to realization that what he was doing to her was wrong. Later on, she proceeded with her life going to University of Ibadan to continue with her studies.

2. Stella:

Stella was Keiziah's roommate while she was at Mayflower University. She was a victim of rape. After that traumatizing experience she decided to be an immoral lady, and getting into the university created a pathway for her. After she came to the University she had different encounters with different people, she had a dream that made her to finally submit her life to the Lord. Stella is a good definition of a Friend, she was always there for Keiziah.

3. Nkanga Nwoko (a.k.a. K.K):

He is a student of Mayflower University, only surviving child of his widowed mother and Demola's Best friend. He was the one who influenced Demola negatively, he encouraged him to rape Keziah. He mistakenly shot Demola instead of a rival cult member and was found guilty of manslaughter, membership of an unlawful society and illegal possession of firearms. Films based on books, always experience slight differences, this can be caused by many factors which include; Time, technology, Budget, and production. It is simply not possible to copy every single detail from a book. Books can go into details giving you a better explanation or understanding of something but films have to be a lot more fast paced otherwise people would lose interest watching, on this note, I would like to mark out the differences between Good Morning, Sodom, the published and the film version.

MOVEMENT 1

The beginning of the scene in the book depicted Keziah outside of her hostel while seeing her mother's car approach and upon her mother seeing her (Keziah), alighted from the car. Whilst, in the movie, the play started off with Keziah's mother, patiently waiting while leaning against her car for her daughter (Keziah).
